PART II

Narrative Summary

The 7th Engineer Battalion (Rein) continued support of the III Marine Amphibious Force throughout the I Corps Tactical Zone with primary effort concentrated in the Da Nang area.

Significant events during April includes emplacement of a 403' MA/MAT6 floating bridge by pass on the Song Cu De at Nam O to reopen Route 1 after two spans of the Nam O bridge were blown. Route 1 was reopened 35 hours after the bridge was destroyed. Projects completed include a 46' steel stringer class 60 bridge on Route 13-c; a 30' timber pile bent bridge and 15' timber bridge on Route 5; installation of barbed wire around piers on four major bridges on Route 1; emplacement of a 799' floating foot bridge adjacent to the Song Cau Do bridge on Route 1 to provide additional observation for security forces; completion of upgrading of Anderson Trail; continued upgrading of Route 5, Dai Loc by pass, Route 13-c; maintenance of 121 km of roads.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Topics

a. Personnel and Administration. None.

b. Enemy, Weather and Terrain.

- (1) 051940H at AT 928786, borrow pit security elemen. detonated unknown type AP mine 4 WIA (1 evac).
- (a) 061056H at BT 113497, Service Company M-51A2, dump truck detonated mine. Truck totally destroyed, no casualties.
- (3) 130412H at AT 927843, One pier of Nam O Bridge on Route 1 blown by V.C. dropping two spans.
- (4) 130730H at BT 046613, MAT6 fixed span on Route 1 blown by V.C.
- (5) 130825H at AT 924605, Company "D" sweep team received intense small arms fire. Squad from 3rd Bn 7th Mar, searched area with negative results. No casualties.
- (6) 140630H at AT 945784, 7th EngrBn security element apprehended one Vietnamese national with 125 rounds of 7.62mm ammunition. Detainee forwarded to 3rd IIT.
- (7) 150900H at AT 991735, Company "A" minefield clearing team detonated M-16 AP mine resulting in one Marine killed and one injured.
- (8) 201230H at BT 006633, Company "B" M51A2 dump truck, detonated mine. Truck heavily damaged, 3 WIA (1 evac).
- (9) 261330H at BT 030647, Company "B" road construction detail received 50 rounds small arms fire. Returned 50-75 rounds small arms fire and searched area with negative results. No casualties.
- (10) 271530H at BT 030647, Company "B" bridge construction detail received 10 rounds sniper fire. Returned 50 rounds small arms fire with unknown results. 1 WIA (non evac).

- (11) 280045H at AT 948707; Company "A" CP received 3 rounds of 105mm artillery from unknown source. 1 KIA, 21 WIA (14 evac, 1DOW).
- (12) 281040H at AT 922537, 1st Bridge Company ferry site at Song Thu Bon received one round sniper fire. No fire returned, no casualties.

c. Organization and Operations

- (2) Operations

- (a) On 4 April a 30' timber pile bent bridge was completed on Route 5 at AT 924606 (See TAB B, photo #4).
- (b) On 29 April a 6" rock cap was completed on 1.5 km of Route 30 (AT 948780 to AT 960776).
- (c) On 11 April a 15' timber bridge was completed on Route 5 at AT 943682.
- (d) On 13 April a 6" rock cap was completed on 2.0 km of route 33 (AT 945787 to AT 951800).
- (e) On 15 April a 403' M4/M4 T6 floating bridge was completed on Rt 1 at Nam O to by pass the damaged permanent bridge at AT 928845.
- (f) On 15 April a 46' steel stringer bridge was completed on Route 13-c at BT 072702. (See TAB B, photo #1).
- (g) On 17 April a 799' floating foot bridge was emplaced at BT 015816 adjacent to the Song Cau Do bridge on Route 1 to provide observation capability for security forces.
- (h) On 18 April a 10,000 square foot helipad was completed at the 1st Marines CP.
- (i) On 23 April security lighting was installed on the Da Nang River Bridge at BT 039761.
- (j) On 29 April a 34' timber pile bent bridge was completed on Route 5 at AT 943691.
- (k) On 30 April the widening and upgrading of 4.0km of Anderson Trail (AT 995663 to BT 032643) was completed.
- (l) On 30 April the lateral road from Route 1 (BT 030647) to the Song Vinh Dien (032648) was completed.

d. Plans

- (1) Construct a 283' timber pile bent bridge across the Song Vinh Dien at BT 032648.
- (2) Construct access road and 10,000 sq.ft. helipad at 1st Bn, 1st Mar. (Vicinity Hoi An).
- (3) Install catwalks on key bridges in Da Nang TAOR to provide observation capability for security forces.
- (4) Continue upgrading of Route 5 from Song Thu Bon Ferry to An Hoa (AT 925530 to AT 874461).
- (5) Continue pioneering and upgrading of Dai Loc by pass via Hill 37 (AT 913591 to AT 921577).

e. Training

- (1) Command Indoctrination and Information continues for newly arrived personnel and debriefing for those departing.
- (2) 66 personnel attended the 1st Engineer Battalion Land Mine Warfare School.
- (3) 11 Personnel attended Generator Operators School.
- (4) One officer attended Embarkation School.
- (5) One Marine attended the Field Radio Operators Course.
- (6) One officer and three enlisted attended ADM school. One was for initial training and three attended refresher training.
- (7) Two supply personnel attended MUMS training.
- (8) One officer completed the Military Justice Course.
- (9) 25 personnel completed a two week Motor Vehicle Operator's Course conducted by this battalion.

f. Logistics, Equipment and Supply

(1) Administration

April

- 4 It was noted that the generator pulley on the EIMCO tractor was causing wear on a cooling system hose. A UER was submitted recommending use of a longer fan belt. The fan belts on all EIMCO tractors within the Battalion are being replaced with satisfactory results.
- 5 A requisition for 12" pipe located at N.S.A. was not filled. The pipe has been programed for a pipeline extension by N.S.A.

The Battalion received a 6,000 pound rough terrain forklift which was assigned to Headquarters Company.
- 6 A letter was sent to Commander Naval Forces Vietnam, Representative Danang, requesting use of real estate in Dien Ban District.
- 7 1st Bridge Company received a 150T46 crane.

A scraper belonging to Company "D" and MRS-100 were returned to the Battalion by the Seabees.
- 10 A report on increased logistics requirements during the monsoon season was submitted to C.G. 1stMarDiv.
- 11 A letter was submitted endorsing a proposed modification of body armor by placing pockets on the outer front.
- 13 A letter was forwarded to C.M.C. requesting that a USMC number be assigned to a sand dehydrator presently in Headquarters Heavy Equipment.
- 14 A letter was sent to Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific requesting that permission be obtained to place EIMCO tractors in service on 14 May 1967.

Four Conex boxes were turned in to FSR.

- 17 All M51A2 Dump Trucks were placed in service. All M51 dump trucks were scheduled to be turned in to Battalion Maintenance for further processing to FSR.
- 18 A list of Fourth Quarter FY 67 requirements for newly received equipment was forwarded to Commanding General, 1st Marine Division.
- 23 Battalion Supply commenced to operate under MUMS program.
- 24 A report of serviceable and unserviceable lower torso body armor was forwarded to Commanding General, 1st Marine Division.
- 25 A letter was sent to Commanding General, 1st Marine Division Attn: Div Supply Officer giving information on the high percentage of priority ϕ 2 requisitions submitted in August 1966.

Plastic and metal jungle boot insets were received and distributed throughout the Battalion.

(2) Supply

(a) 7th Engineer Battalion FME (RUC 21300)

During the month of April the Battalion Supply Section processed 70 priority ϕ 2 and ϕ 5 requisitions and 1407 priority 12 and 17 requisitions. Also processed were 2260 receipts from due, 2048 issues from due and 278 issues from warehouse.

(b) 1st Bridge Company FME (RUC 21325)

During the month of April 1st Bridge Company Supply Section processed 462 requisitions. Also processed were 212 receipts from due, 189 issues from due and 125 issues from warehouse.

(c) 3rd Bridge Company FME (RUC 21335)

During the month of April 3rd Bridge Company Supply Section processed 97 requisitions. Also processed were receipts from due 36, issues from due 42, and issues from warehouse 236.

(3) Motor Transport

Approximately 141,369 miles were logged on the Battalion's Motor Transport Vehicles during April.

(4) Maintenance

The Battalion Maintenance Platoon completed 147 Motor Transport work orders during the month of April. A total of 164 work orders were submitted, 29 were sent to MAINT. BN. Total work orders for Engineer Equipment numbered 185 with 148 completed and 23 were sent to FLSG-"A".

(5) Messing

The Battalion Mess Staff continued the normal mess operation of providing four (4) meals daily except on Sunday; the fourth meal being a midnight ration for night crews. On Sunday a brunch replaces breakfast and dinner.

(6) Medical

The Battalion Aid Station treated 601 military and 363 Vietnamese. During the month of April the Dental Clinic treated 321 military and 14 Vietnamese.

 - (a) MED CAP program provided treatment to 363 persons.
 - (b) The Battalion sponsored, Vietnamese brickyard produced a total of 30,072 soil bricks.
 - (c) A total of 544 bars of soap were given out to the Vietnamese people.
 - (d) A total of 21,966 bricks were released from the 7th Engineer Battalion Brick Factory during the month of April for various projects.
 - (e) A total of 8,532 cement bricks were produced at the HOA VINH Refugee Village for the month of April 1967.
 - (f) A ground breaking ceremony was held in the Village of HOA VINH on 2 April 1967 for the construction of the Village Chief's Administrative Office. Present at the ceremony were Lieutenant Colonel Frank W. HARRIS III, the Commanding Officer, 7th Engineer Battalion (Rein), FMF, accompanied by the 7th Engineer Battalion Civil Affairs Officer, and the Chief, Mr TOA, of HOA VINH Village.
