NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 7th Engineer Battalion continued support of the III Marine Amphibious Force within the Danang area. Platoons from the attached 1st and 3rd Bridge Companies are rendering additional support in the Chu Lai, Hue/Phu Bai, and Dong Ha areas.

Company "A", 9th Engineer Battalion moved its CP from 7th Engineer Battalion to Hill 63 BT 132452 on 16 July 1967. All elements are conducting engineer operations on Route 1 between Danang and Thang Binh to upgrade Highway 1 for class 50 traffic.

Company "B", 7th Engineer Battalion continues operations on Route 12 and the Ha Thanh Dam. Cooper Bridge at BT 032649 was completed. It is a 297' monotube pile bent, class 60 bridge. 2,248 meters of new road was constructed on Route 12 between Route 1 BT 032649 and Route 13C.

Work is continuing on Route 5 by "A" and "D" Companies to bring it above the high water mark and to cap it with crushed rock. During July 30, 587 yards³ of fill and 5,437 yards³ of rock were placed and compacted on Route 5.

Engineer assistance was provided on Hill 327 from "C" Battery, 1st LAAM Battalion. 8 bunkers were rehabilitated; culverts installed; and the area graded and shaped for drainage.

The minefield at the 37th Signal Battalion was cleared with negative findings. Also, another sector of the Danang Air Base minefield is being cleared. 67 - M14's and 26 - M16's have been detected and blown in place.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Topics

a. Personnel and Administration. None.

b. Enemy, Weather and Terrain

- (1) 13 UNK H at BT 100519, a culvert was blown on Route 1.
- (2) 13 UNK H at BT 102516, a bridge was destroyed on Route 1.
- (3) 14 UNK H at AT 932888, bridge on Route 1 was blown. A 30' M4T6 fixed span was installed.
- (4) 14 UNK H at BT 093535, the recently constructed wingwalls on a bridge on Route 1 were blown.
- (5) 15 UNK H at AT 943691, a 30' timber bridge on Route 5 was blown. It was replaced with a 30' M4T6 fixed span.
- (6) 150930H at BT 093543, Company "A", 9th EngrBn road construction crew received 10 to 15 rounds automatic weapons fire. Security element called in a fire mission. Resulting in 3 Vietnamese Nationals killed and 1 wounded.

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- (7) 192120H at BT 004654, Company "B" received 8 rounds of small arms fire. Notified infantry. No fire returned.
- (8) 210930H at BT 085545, Company "A", 9th EngrBn dump truck detonated unknown type mine on Route 1. The truck was destroyed. There were 5 WIA's all med evaced.
- (9) 241530H at AT 918598, Company "D" road construction crew on Route 5 fired on enemy with unknown results. Notified infantry in the area.
- (10) 251303H at BT 085545, Company "A", 9th EngrBn road construction crew received a grenade from unknown number of enemy. Captured 3 VC suspects, turned over to the infantry for interrogation. There was 1 Marine WIA med evaced.
- (11) 251547H at BT 015736, a man from Company "A", 7th EngrBn detonated a mine in a minefield operation. One man was med evaced.
- (12) 271440H at AT 978623, Company "B" construction crew received 3 rounds small arms fire. Security returned 2 rounds M-79 at suspected sniper position.
- (13) 280640H at BT 019638, Company "A", 9th EngrBn dump truck detonated unknown type mine on mine sweep. There were 2 WIA's, 1 med evaced and 1 minor.
- (14) 281302H at AT 979632, Company "B" construction crew received 2 rounds small arms fire. Security returned 1 round M-79 at suspected sniper position.
- (15) 311150H at BT 102514, Company "A", 9th EngrBn received 5 rounds small arms fire at job site. Security returned fire with unknown results.
- (16) 311415H at BT 105515, Company "A", 9th EngrBn at job site observed enemy in tree line with weapons. Security fired 200 rounds small arms fire with unknown results.
- (17) 311525H at AT 984629, Company "B" dump truck received 1 round small arms fire. Driver of the vehicle received facial wounds, taken to Hill 55 BAS.
- (18) 311620H at BT 102515, Company "A", 9th EngrBn received 10 rounds small arms fire at job site. Security returned fire on enemy. Observed 1 enemy fall. Searched area finding tunnels, tunnels were blown with hand grenades. Received 5 to 10 more rounds small arms fire from the enemy.
- (19) 311935H at BT 102514, Company "A", 9th EngrBn at job site observed 2 enemy with rifles. Fired upon them observing 1 enemy fall.

c. Organization and Operations

- (2) Operations
 - (a) On 7 July 1967 Cooper Bridge across the Song Vinh Dien was completed.
 - (b) On 8 July 1967, a 40' class 60, steel stringer bridge was completed on Route I BT 045615.

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- On 9 July 1967 earthwork for a mobile storage and platoon living area for 1st LAMM Battalion were completed on Hill 724 AF 922920.
- (d) On 12 July 1967 the CAS Unit Headquarters at China Beach was completely renovated.
 - (e) A pioneered road was completed on 22 July 1967 from the Song Cam Lam Ferry (BT 083543) to Route 1 (BT 093536).
 - (f) Engineer assistance provided to "C" Battery, 1st LAMM Battalion on Hill 327 was completed on 26 July 1967. 4 - 36" culverts were installed, 8 bunkers rehabilitated and the area was graded and shaped for drainage.
 - (g) On 15 July 1967 a 30' M4T6 fixed span was emplaced over a concrete bridge destroyed by the enemy AT 933888.
 - (h) On 15 July 1967 a 625' M4/class 60 superstructure floating bridge was emplaced at the Song Thu Bon AT 925535 to replace the ferry.
 - (i) On 15 July 1967 a 30' M4T6 fixed span was emplaced over a timber bridge AT 943691 which was damaged by the enemy.
 - (j) Construction of a 200 x 300 helopad on Hill 63 BT 132452 Headquarters for 5th Marines was started 17 July 1967. 90% of work has been completed.

- (1) Continue upgrading of Route 5 between AT 943746 and AT 912577.
- (2) Continue construction of new lateral road designated Route 12.
- (3) Continue construction of Dai Loc Bypass AT 9158.
- (4) Complete construction of helopad on Hill 63 BT 132452.
- (5) Continue Danang Air Base minefield operations.
- (6) Continue upgrading of Route 1 from Danang to Thang Binh.

- 18 A request for ABFC components was forwarded to CG, III MAF. The required materials were for a bridge to be constructed at BT 113497.
- A request for two portable rock crushers and a crawler crane slated for salvage, was forwarded to CG, U.S. Army Support Command, Quinhon.
- 19 A material Readiness Assistance Team from 1st Marine Division visited this Battalion.
- 24 An Unsatisfactory Equipment Report for the pipe inlet on the Eimco (M-64) Tractor was submitted to GMC.
- 25 A request for a water distributor M-61 located in salvage was forwarded to CG, U.S. Army Support Command, Quinhon.

(2) Supply(a) 7th Engineer Battalion FMF (RUC 21300)

During the month of July the Battalion Supply Section processed 83 priority 02 and 204 priority 05 requisitions and 1449 priority 12 and 17 requisitions. Also processed were 681 receipts from due, 524 issues from due and 138 issues from warehouse.

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(b) 1st Bridge Company EMF (RUC 21325)

During the month of July 1st Bridge Company Supply Section processed 702 requisitions. Also processed were 203 receipts from due, 197 issues from due and 31 issues from warehouse.

(c) 3rd Bridge Company EMF (RUC 21335)

During the month of July 3rd Bridge Company Supply Section processed 234 requisitions. Also processed were 18 receipts from due, 18 issues from due, and 72 issues from warehouse.

(3) Motor Transport

Approximately 156,725 miles were logged on the Battalion's Motor Transport Vehicles during July.

(4) Maintenance

The Battalion Maintenance Platoon completed 128 Motor Transport work orders during the month of July. A total of 151 work orders were submitted, 35 were sent to Maint Bn.. Total work orders for Engineer Equipment numbered 140 with 134 completed and 12 were sent to FLSG "A".

(5) Messing

The Battalion Mess Staff continued to provide four meals daily except on Sunday; the fourth meal being a midnight ration for night crews. On Sunday a brunch replaces breakfast and dinner.

The Battalion Aid Station treated 1468 Military and 794 Vietnamese. During the month of July the Dental Clinic treated 497 Military and 30 Vietnamese.

g. Civil Affairs/Civic Action

(1) The civil affairs program continues in a daily basis.

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(2) Activities were as follows:

- (a) MED CAP program provided treatment to 742 persons.
- (b) The Battalion sponsored, Vietnamese brickyard produced a total of 39,640 soil bricks.
- (c) A total of 32,889 bricks were released from the 7th Engineer Battalion Brick Factory during the month of July for various projects.
- (d) A total of 9,424 cement bricks were produced at the Hoa Ninh Refugee Village for the month of July 1967.
- (e) A 16' x 28' curing shed was constructed at the Hoa Ninh Brick Factory.
- (f) A 52' x 16' school is under construction and scheduled to be completed on 5 August at Hoa Ninh. A 78' x 18' school and 26' x 25' School Master's House are under construction at Hoa Thanh.
