PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 7th Engineer Battalion continued support of the III Marine Amphibious Force within the Da Nang area. Platoons from the attached 1st and 3rd Bridge Companies are rendering additional support in the Chu Lai, Hæ/Phu Bai, and Dong Ha areas.

During June elements of Co A, 9th Engineer Battalion were re-located to the 1st Bn 1st Marines TAOR to begin the repair and upgrading of National Route 1 between Da Nang and Thang Binh. The total project will include the repair or replacement of bridges and drainage structures and pavement rehabilitation necessary to open this section for class 50 traffic prior to the 1967-68 monsoon season.

Company B was relocated to the 2nd Bn 1st Marines TAOR to enable them to more efficiently conduct engineer operations in that area. Major projects include construction of a 283' class 35/55 bridge across the Song Vinh Dien near Bo Mung Hamlet. Upon completion of the bridge construction of a lateral road connecting Route 1 and Route 13C will be started. The bridge will be named in memory of Corporal Andrew J. COOPER who was killed by sniper fire on 15 May 1967 while working on the bridge.

Company B is continuing work on the rebuilding of an irrigation dam in the Ha Thanh area. A steel sheet pile core and a sheet pile spillway protective wall have been 12% completed. The remainder of the dam will be compacted earth fill with a concrete cap. This project is being constructed in conjunction with CORDS to provide storage and control of irrigation water for the local farm lands.

Work continues on Route 5' by Companies "A" and "D" to bring the road elevation above high water mark and to surface the road with crushed rock. During June 12,684 cubic yards of fill and 5,878 cubic yards of crushed rock were placed and compacted on Route 5.

The major portion of the Da Nang Air Base minefield has been cleared. Since the project began in July 1966, 27,000 man hours have been expended by Companies "C" and "D". 1032 M-16 Bounding AP mines and 1571 M-14 blast type AP mines have been removed from the field. Six Marines were injured while clearing this uncharted minefield.

- (1) 071015H at AT 900806, Service Company dump truck detonated box mine approximately 15 lbs, pressure type. No casualties.
- (2) 111020H at YD 756143, 3rd Bridge ferry site at Phu Bai received small arms and mortar fire. 2 WIA.
- (3) 201600H at BT 014736, One man from "C" Company detonated a M-14 mine in the Da Nang mine field. 1 WIA (evac).
- (4) 220845H at AT 943670, "A" Company dump truck detonated a box mine on route #5. 1 WIA (med evac).
- (5) 251000H at AT 942643, "D" Company dump truck detonated a box mine on route #14. 3 WIA (med evac).
- (6) 270855H at AT 950582, "D" Company dump truck working with "A" Company sweep team detonated a mine while returning to "A" Company CP. The truck was destroyed and 1 Vietnamese civilian was wounded.
- (7) 271615H at AT 914736, Service Company dump truck received 2 rounds sniper on route #5. 1 WIA (minor).

c. Organization and Operations

- (2) Operations
 - (a) On 1 June a 40,000 square foot asphalt coated soil cement helipad was completed at the 1st Marines CP.
 - (b) On 10 June a 10' x 24' x 8'6" bunker was completed at M&G-11.
 - (c) On 15 June preliminary earth work for a resettlement hamlet near Marble Mountain was completed.
 - (d) On 15 June a 4 float class 50/55 M4/M4T6 ferry was emplaced adjacent to the Cooper Bridge (BT 032649) to transfer tanks and engineer equipment to the east bank pending completion of the bridge.
 - (e) On 16 June completed upgrading and modifying the ASP 1 minefield.
 - (f) On 22 June one (1) 5' x 36' metal culvert was installed on Route 1 BT 047611.
 - (g) On 26 June a 165 foot M6 bridge was emplaced at AT 926867, class 35 on Route 1.
 - (h) On 27 June completed clearing Da Nang Air Base minefield. Project started 26 July 1966. 1032 M-16 and 1571 M-14 mines were removed or destroyed. 27,000 man hours were expended.
 - (i) On 27 June completed engineer assistance to 1st Engineer Battalion in clearing and destroying caves and booby traps in Can Ne Village AT 980690.

d. Plans

- (1) Emplace ferry on Route 1 at the Song Cau Lau to allow movement of engineer equipment south of the river. This will enable construction of the south approach to the new Cau Lau bridge now under construction by civilian contractors as well as repair and installation of bridges and drainage structures on Route 1 between the Song Cau Lau and the Song Ba Ren.
- (2) Continue upgrading Route 5 between Tuy Loan (AT 943746) and Dai Loc (AT 912577).
- (3) Continue construction of the new lateral route to be designated Route 12.
- (4) Continue construction of Cooper Bridge (BT 032649) and Ha Thanh Dam BT 004654.
- (5) Continue construction of Dai Loc Bypass AT 9158 and Route 14 AT 968584 to BT 056589.
- (6) Continue work on helipad AT 940786 at 2/7 CP.
- (7) Start to clear area for missile storage and platoon size living area on Hill 724 AT 9455920.

e. Training

- (1) Command Indoctrination and information for newly arrived personnel and debriefing for those departing.
- (2) 66 personnel attended the 1st Engineer Battalion "Land Mine Warfare" school.
- (3) One officer and (3) enlisted attended ADM school, (3) attended the initial course of instruction, (1) attended refresher training.
- (4) 15 personnel attended 50 Cal. machine gun class, instructed by 1st Marine Division instructors.
- (5) 109 Marine personnel Fam Fired .50 Cal machine gun.
- (6) 1310 personnel Fam Fired M16E1 on the Battalion 1000 inch range.
- (7) Officers & SNCO's attended a lecture on the 105 air compressor pneumatic tools.
- (8) A quarterly training schedule for Officers and Staff NCO's has been set for 1st quarter of FY 68 as per TAB C.

- 4 A generator 45 KW, 400 cycle, USMC # 233050 retrieved by Company "A" of this Battalion was reported to III MAF Engineer Office for information.
- 5 A tunnel destruction set was received by this Battalion, assigned to Company "B" and will be evaluated with a report being forward to Commanding General, 1st Marine Division by 15 July 1967.
- 6 A Butler building constructed by the Seabees was accepted for use by the Utilities Platoon.

A request for \$73,880.43 to be added to the Battalion's Project Code "O" funds to offset the cost of fuel consumed was submitted to the Commanding General, 1st Marine Division.

- 8 A priority 12 requisition for 3 grid rollers was submitted in accordance with CG, 1st MarDiv msg 020031Z Jun67.

A letter was submitted in response to a Division request to give a recommended allocation of 1600 feet of floating bridge and 25 outboard motors.

- 9 A visit was paid by the F.S.R. Fire Inspector who provided guidance for improvement of the Battalion's fire fighting capability.
 - 12 Under instructions from Commanding General, 1st Marine Division, six caliber .50 machine guns were invoiced to the 1st Tank Battalion. Replacements were not requisitioned in accordance with C.G., 1st Marine Division msg 120615ZJun67.
- All QRLs for the three accounts within this Battalion were completed and turned in as required.
- 13 Route 1A was closed to all Battalion traffic.

A report of failures and causes to the 8 yard scraper (FSN 3805-051-3139) was submitted to the Division Engineer.

- 15 A recommended list of secondary non-depot items was forwarded to Commanding General, 1st Marine Division.

The first two Worthington 600 CFM air compressors were received by this Battalion.

- 17 Mr. W.A. SHETTLER, Project Engineer, Pope, Evans and Robbins International, Ltd requested an estimate on power requirements at present, in six months and in a year.

- 23 A request for funds in the amount of \$17,528.86 to be added to Project Code "O" Funds was forwarded to the Commanding General, 1st Marine Division.

- 24 A request for ABFC assemblies was forwarded to Commanding General, III MAF. The request was for abutments, interior piers, bridge superstructure and culvert.

(2) Supply

(a) 7th Engineer Battalion FME (RUC 21300)

During the month of June the Battalion Supply Section processed 96 priority 02 and 05 requisitions and 1093 priority 12 and 17 requisitions. Also processed were 933 receipts from due, 900 issues from due and 228 issues from warehouse.

(b) 1st Bridge Company FME (RUC 21325)

During the month of June 1st Bridge Company Supply Section processed 395 requisitions. Also processed were 146 receipts from due, 139 issues from due and 60 issues from warehouse.

(c) 3rd Bridge Company FME (RUC 21335)

During the month of June, 3rd Bridge Company Supply Section processed 161 requisitions. Also processed were 43 receipts from due, 28 issues from due and 113 issues from warehouse.

(3) Motor Transport

Approximately 139,902 miles were logged on the Battalion's Motor Transport Vehicles during June.

(4) Maintenance

The Battalion Maintenance Platoon completed 112 Motor Transport work orders during the month of June. A total of 118 work orders were submitted, 10 were sent to Maint Bn.. Total work orders for Engineer Equipment numbered 145 with 133 completed and 13 were sent to FLSG "A".

(5) Messing

The Battalion Mess Staff continued to provide four meals daily except on Sunday; the fourth meal being a midnight ration for night crews. On Sunday a brunch replaces breakfast and dinner.

(6) Medical

The Battalion Aid Station treated 2,752 military and Vietnamese. During the month of June the Dental Clinic treated no military or Vietnamese.

 - (d) A total of 40,061 bricks were released from the 7th Engineer Battalion Brick Factory during the month of June for various projects.
 - (e) A total of 13,100 cement bricks were produced at the HOA NINH Refugee Village for the month of June 1967.
 - (f) The opening ceremony for the Village's Chief Office in HOA NINH was held on 9 June 1967. Present at the ceremony were Lieutenant Colonel Frank W. HARRIS III, Commanding Officer of 7th Engineer Battalion, Battalion S-5, Division Headquarters Drum and Bugle Corps, and HELF DUC Assistant District Chief.

(g) The dedication ceremony for the HOA VINH Dam was held on 27 June 1967. Lieutenant Colonel Frank W. HARRIS III, Commanding Officer of 7th Engineer Battalion, Lieutenant Colonel PETERSON, G-5 1st Marine Division, Major HARRIS, G-5 III MAF Representative, Major Hau, HOA VANG District Chief attending. The music was furnished by III MAF Drum and Bugle Corps. Security for the project was provided by CAC I-4 in cooperation with 2-7.
