Narrative Summary

The 7th Engineer Battalion (Rein) continued support of the III Marine Amphibious Force throughout I Corps Tactical Zone with primary effort concentrated in the Da Nang area.

Significant events during March included completion of a 105 foot, single lane, class 60 pile bent bridge on Route 5 south of the Tuy Loan River; completion of two single lane, class 60 bridges of 24 foot and 11 foot lengths on Route 5 north of the Tuy Loan River; continued construction of a 30 foot, class 60 pile bent bridge on Route 5 and a 46 foot steel stringer bridge on Route 13-C; completion of a 10,000 square foot soil cement heli pad at 3rd Bn, 1st Mar CP; completion of a dental facility on Hill 37; continued upgrading of 24 km of roads and maintenance of 121 km of roads.

(2) Supply

- (a) 7th Engineer Battalion FMF (RUC 21300). During the month of March the Battalion Supply Section processed 280 priority 02 and 05 requisitions and 1890 12 and 17 requisitions. Also processed were 2053 receipts from due, 1589 issues from due and 609 issues from warehouse.
- (b) 1st Bridge Company FMF (RUC 21325). During the month of March 1st Bridge Company Supply Section processed 251 requisitions. Also processed were 136 receipts from due, 85 issues from due and 70 issues from warehouse.
- (c) 3rd Bridge Company FMF (RUC 21335). During the month of March 3rd Bridge Company Supply Section processed 381 requisitions. Also processed were 24 receipts from due, 9 issues from due and 36 issues from warehouse.
- (3) Motor Transport. Approximately 183,612 miles were logged on the Battalion's Motor Transport vehicles during March.

g. Civil Affairs/Civic Action

- (1) The civil affairs program continues on a daily basis.
- (2) Activities were as follows:
 - (a) MED CAP program provided treatment to 458 persons.
 - (b) The Battalion sponsored, Vietnamese brickyard produced a total of 31,344 soil bricks.
 - (c) A total of 870 bars of soap were given out to the Vietnamese people.
 - (d) A total of 15,310 bricks were released from the 7th Engineer Battalion Brick Factory during the month of March for various projects.
 - (e) The 7th Engineer Battalion is sponsoring a Brick Factory in its Civil Affairs area at the Refugee Village of HOA NINH. One brick machine has been taken out to the Village for the production of cement block which are intended for Civil Affairs projects. This new Brick Factory is on an experimental basis to determine the feasibility of its operation. The Village Chief of HOA THANH is having sand hauled to the site of the brick machine and the Village Chief of HOA NINH has the operational control of production. Since the beginning of the Brick Factory, 24 March 1967, in HOA NINH there have been 2044 bricks produced.
