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## NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 7th Engineer Battalion continued support of the III Marines Amphibious Force within the Danang area. Platoons from the attached 1st and 3rd Bridge Companies are rendering additional support in the Chu Lai, Hue/Phu Bai, and Dong Ha areas.

Company "A", 9th Engineer Battalion continued engineering operations on Route 1 between Danang and Thang Binh to upgrade Highway 1 for class 50 traffic inspite of intensive enemy sabotage and a greatly increased rainfall in the area.

Company "B", 7th Engineer Battalion completed the earthwork on Route 12 and it was opened to traffic. The final drainage and placement of culverts will be accomplished in the future. The Ha Thanh Dam Project was secured until after monsoons due to heavy rainfall and rising water.

Work continued on Route 5 by "A" and "D" Companies to bring it above the high water mark and to cap it with crushed rock. During September 4010 cubic yards of Rock and 3200 cubic yards of Fill were placed and compacted.

Company "C", 7th Engineer Battalion drove their test piles and worked on site preparations for the Ha Dong Bridge (AT 998707), a 340' pile bent design.

1st Bridge Company, 7th Engineer Battalion removed 658' of M4 Tactical Bridging from the Song Thu Bon (AT 925532), with the opening of a 2040' Pile Bent Bridge (Constructed by MCB 4).

Service Company, 7th Engineer Battalion provided 2,011,500 gallons of water from their nine (9) water points for use in the Danang TAOR.

During the month of September the Battalion Supply Section processed 70 priority 02 and 120 priority 05 requisitions and 2030 priority 12 and 17 requisitions. Also processed were 759 receipts from due, 848 issues from due and 370 issues from warehouse.

(b) 1st Bridge Company FMF (RUC 21325)

During the month of September 1st Bridge Company Supply Section processed 685 requisitions. Also processed were 228 receipts from due, 194 issues from due and 49 issues from warehouse.

The Battalion Aid Station treated 1061 Military and 113 Vietnamese. During the month of September the Dental Clinic treated 410 Military and 6 Vietnamese.

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## REPORT OF ROCKET ATTACK ON 2 SEPTEMBER 1967

At approximately 0100 on 2 September 1967 the sound of incoming Rockets was heard and then a series of explosions. These were quite close. As it was later discovered four (4) of these Rockets impacted approximately 100 meters to the northwest of the 7th Engineer Battalion perimeter positions. Perimeter Security observing the strikes felt there were two (2) duds in the rice patty. However, a check of the area revealed that if there were duds, they had gone too far beneath the patty water to be visible from the surface. At the same time rockets could be seen and heard striking in the area of FLC. This strike was followed by a slight pause and then a volley of four (4) or five (5) rockets came in striking FLC in what appeared to be the Area just inside Gate Number 3.

The rocket attack was followed by very intensive small arms and automatic weapons fire along the entire Northern Section of the perimeter. An estimated 25 to 30 VC being along the road (Route 33). Fire continued at a moderate rate until approximately 0345 along this section of the perimeter with only occasional pauses. From 0345 to 0615 fire was sporadic of the sniper variety.

During the period 0230 to 0515 the perimeter in the vicinity of AT 946774 observed and heard heavy movement of enemy personnel moving in what appeared to be, an East to West direction. Fire was occasionally received from this area but was transitory in nature and varied in intensity from one (1) or two (2) rounds to long bursts of automatic weapons fire.

Casualty figures were 2 USMC KIA, 5 USMC WIA. No known VC casualties although several members of the perimeter believed they had scored hits. All Casualties were the result of small arms fire.
