#### NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 7th Engineer Battalion continued support of the III Marine Amphibious Force within the DaNang area. The Battalion continued maintenance responsibility of 70 miles of road and conducted daily mine sweeps of 38 miles of road. The Battalion maintained 7 water points in the DaNang area producing 4,388,300 gallons of water. One platoon of the 1st Bridge Company continued to furnish tactical bridge support to the 9th Engineer Battalion at Chu Lai.

Company "A", 7th Engineer Battalion continued maintenance of Rt# 540 and 30 for class 50 traffic and maintenance of Route 540 from AT 899774 to AT 912743 Route 542, Route 544 and Route 10. One platoon is located at Hai Van Pass to conduct daily mine sweeps of Route GL-1N from AT 927843 to AT 886957. Company "A" also conducts daily mine sweeps of Route 545.

Company "B", 7th Engineer Battalion continued upgrading Route QI-1S in preparation for paving. Company "B" is also responsible for maintenance and upgrading on Route 4 from BT 056589 to AT 968584. Due to the tactical situation this portion of the route is not being used. Company "B" conducts daily mine sweeps of Route QI-1S from AT 999707 to BT 077651.

Company "C", 7th Engineer Battalion continued upgrading on Route 540 from AT 912743 to AT 927608. Company "C" also conducts daily mine sweeps of Route 540 from AT 943663 to AT 927608 and is in the process of upgrading this section of road.

Company "D", 7th Engineer Battalion continued upgrading on Route 540 from AT 927608 to AT 874460 for class 50 traffic and maintenance of Route 4. Areas east of Hill 37 and west of Hill 65 were inaccessable due to the current tactical situation. Company "D" conducts daily mine sweeps of Route 540 from AT 927608 to AT 925533.





Under 10 piles were chi coms, under 5 BT 040625 piles were 1 gallon cans, under 1 pile was a 105mm illumination round. The barricade was composed of 5 trees stratched across the road about 3 feet high with rocks and barbed wire. Grappled barricade from road and blew ordnance.

- 190820H Company "B" sweep team flank received sniper fire from the east at BT 040631. Checked out area and continued with caution. Negative casualties were sustained.
- 191005H Company "D" 2nd Platoon received seven B-40 rockets. AT 875477 Personnel manned lines. Negative casualties were sustained.
- 191305H Operator from Land Clearing Company operating an M64 AT 993548 tripped a surprise firing device type 60mm while digging out a bunker. Negative injuries with slight damage to M-64. was sustained. Completed destruction of bunker and sent M64 back to CP.
- 210045H Land Clearing Company lines were probed by an enemy unit BT 585563 of unknown size. Received small arms fire. Personnel returned small arms, M-79, 60mm fire and M-26 grenades. Negative friendly casualties and enemy results unknown.
- 211740H Land Clearing Company personnel found one ammo box of PRC 88 and PRC 25 batteries; one ammo box of chow; one ammo box of AK-47 rounds; one ammo box of chi coms; four boxes of assorted clothing and 782 gear; five M-16 magazines; one ammo box of M-79 rounds, M-1 carbine rounds, and loose rounds; 400 M-60 ammo rounds; one 20 pound rock mine; one 38 caliber revolver US made; one USMC ID card; one Geneva Convention Card; one box of guider charges for RPG; and one 60mm round. All were blown in place except pistol and documents.
- 250925H Company "D" sweep team found one M-16 anti-personnel AT 91150 mine. Removed mine and blew it.
- 270750H Company "B" sweep team found one home-made booby-trap
  approximately 15 to 20 meters on west side of road. Mine
  was made of Air Force weather ballistic device, and was
  booby trapped with wire running up to road, also could
  have been battery operated due to a battery trap. Blown
  in place.
- 271300H Company "C" personnel while on patrol located two small AT 954109 bunkers dug into hillside. Bunkers were blown.
- 281455H Company "C" operator driving an M-52 towing M-172 lowbed AT 901724 with M-64 on board hit approximately a 20 lb. box mine.

- (2) Operations 1 7 August 1969
- (a) Horizontal Construction The Ton Backers Buttered Delication their effort to upgrade and maintain Route QL-1S by hauling, spreading, grading and rolling 1965.8 cu.yds. of 6"(-) rock and 333.8 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock in the vicinity of BT 035634, in preparation for paving this section of the road. Maintenance of Route 540 was continued by hauling, spreading, grading and compacting 625 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock from AT 923609 to AT 933623. They also hauled and spread3000 gallons of oil in the vicinity of AT 943663 to AT 937635 to aid in dust suppression and mine detection. The 7th Engineer Battalion continued to upgrade the An Hoa Road by hauling, spreading and compacting 2974 or.yds. of fill in the vicinity of AT 924525. 530 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock was hauled, spread, and rolled in the vicinity of AT 923526 and 8000 gallons of oil was hauled and spread from AT 928520 to AT 874561, to aid in mine detection and dust suppression on this section of the road. At the 3rd 175mm Gun Battery Cantonment, the 7th Engineer Battalion continued to upgrade the in-camp roads by hauling, spreading and grading 338 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock and installing 36' of 18" culvert. At the Phu Loc (6) stockpile 350 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock was hauled and stockpiled for future use on the An Hoa Road. Civilian contractors hauled 445 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock to the Company "C" stockpile, to be used in maintaining Route 540.
- (2) Vertical Construction The 7th Engineer Battalion has made plans to reconstruct the 500 barrel tank and tower that was destroyed by fire at 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines. All of the storm damage at Hill 37 and Hill 55 was completed on 5 August 1969. The 3 gun pads for the 1st 175mm Gun Battery was completed on 7 August 1969. The 250 barrel water tank and tower at the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines was completed on 1 August 1969. On 5 August 1969 the TV Repeater unit was completed at the Hai Van Pass. At the 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines compound the 7th Engineer Battalion statted construction of the last 10 strongbacks. The construction of the 5 standard culvert bunkers at TRC-97 is 91% complete. The bunkers at the R&R center for III MAF are 45% complete. Construction continued on the standard fighting culvert bunkers with fugasse devices for MACS-4, at Monkey Mountain. The 7th Engineer Battalion is 10% compolete on the construction of the 30' replacement towers for the DaNang Barrier. The 40' x 100! butler building at the 5th/7th Communication Battalions is 55% complete at this time. The grease trap at the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines is all complete except for the plumbing hook up. The 7th Engineer Battalion continued construction of the 200 man mess hall at the Liberty Bridge for the 5th Marines. All the concrete has been poured for the interior walls and footings.

- (2) 250 barrel water storage tank and towers at the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines was completed on 1 August 1969.

(3) The 3 gun pads for the 1st 175mm Gun Battery were completed on 7 August 1969.

(4) The storm damage repairs at Hill 37 and 55 were completed on 5 August 1969.

## (3) Operations - 8 -14 August 1969

- (a) Horizontal Construction On 12 August the Thanh Quit Bridge at BT 042621 on Route QL-1S was blown. 1st Bridge Company installed a 751 floating M4 Bridge to open the road. The 7th Engineer Battalion hauled, spread, and graded 2036.6 cu.yds. of 6"(-) rock and 44.8 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock on Route QL-1S in the vicinity of the Thanh Quit, in preparation for paving. The 7th Engineer Battalion continued maintenance of Route 540 by hauling, spreading, grading and compacting 630 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock from AT 922572 to AT 933623. 17,000 gallons of oil was hauled and spread to aid in mine detection and dust suppression. There was 70' of 36" culvert installed at AT 919519 to aid in drainage. The 7th Engineer Battelion continued to upgrade the An Hoa Road by hauling, spreading and compacting 15,290 cu.yds. of fill in the vicinity of AT 926513 to AT 926517, the fill was capped with 445 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock plus 60' of 36" culvert was installed at AT 914513. Maintenance of Route 545 and Route 10 continued. The 7th Engineer Battalion hauled 45 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock to the Phu Loc (6) stockpile for future use on the An Hoa Road. Civilian contractors hauled 887 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock to be used for future use on Route 540. The Provisional Land Clearing Company continued the land Clearing operation on Go Noi Island. The 7th Engineer Battalion continued to support the 2nd ROK Brigade with four Eimco tractors, on their land clearing operation.
- (b) Vertical Construction The 7th Engineer Battalion construction slowed considerably do to the tactical situation during this period. The 7th Engineer Battalion continued construction of the mess halls in the Hai Van Pass area and Liberty Bridge area. The 5th/7th Communication Battalion cantonments continued as the 40° x 100° butler building construction neared completion. The 7th Engineer Battalion continued to construct bunkers at TRC-97, Monkey Mountain for MACS-4, and III MAF R&R center. The 7th Engineer Battalion continued to work on the foundation for the new Battalion Aid Station at the 7th Engineer Battalion Command Post. The construction of 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines Cantonment near completion as work continued on the last ten strongback huts. Work continued on the replacement towers for the DaNang Barrier continued on schedule during this period

## (c) Engineer Comments - Significant Events

12 August 1969 - The Thanh Quit Bridge at BT 042621 on Route QL-1S was blown. 1st Bridge Company installed a 75° floating M4 Bridge to open road.



## (3) Operations - 15 -21 August 1969

- (a) Horizontal Construction The 7th Engineer Battalion surveyed the road behind the berm and made preparations to begin construction. Upgrading and maintenance of Route QL-1S continued by hauling, spreading, grading and rolling 535 cu.yds. of 6"(-) rock and 1277 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock in the vicinity of Song Thanh Quit, in preparation for paving. On the An Hoa Road 13,940 cu.yds. of fill and 75 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock were hauled, spread, graded and rolled.
  13,000 gallons of water and 2000 gallons of oil was spread to aid in road compaction, dust suppression and mine detection. 40' of 36" culvert and 70' of 48" culvert were also installed to aid drainage. Maintenance of Route 540 was continued by grading and shaping the road from AT 899774 to AT 908744. Work on Route 540 was kept to a minimum this week in order to divert construction assets to Route QL-1S. The 7th Engineer Battalions Provisional Land Clearing Company continued to support 1st Marine Division units in a tactical land clearing operation.
- (b) Vertical Construction The 7th Engineer Battalion began construction of 3-40' observation towers for 610 Transportation Company. The wall frames and rafters are complete on the 12' x 12' generator shed at the Cam Le Bridge for the 1st MP's. At Hill 327 construction was begun on a 20' x 34' bunker. There were two (2) 30' sentry towers for the An Hoa Combat Base flown into position on 21 August 1969. The 7th Engineer Battalion completed construction of 5 standard fighting culvert bunkers at TRC-97, Monkey Mountain. Construction f the eight (8) 12' x 28' bunkers at the R&R center for III MAF. At the Hai Van Pass the roof trusses were erected on the 250 man mess hall and the construction is continuing. The last phase of the metal 40' x 100' building is nearing completion. The building is at the 6th/7th Communication Battalions Cantonment. The 7th Engineer Battalion began re-construction of the 500 barrel water storage tank and tower for the 1st Marines (east). The 250 man mess hall at the Liberty Bridge has the deck poured and now the wall frames and roof trusses are being fabricated. Installion of the piles and barrels for the two (2) 175mm gun pads at the An Hoa Combat Base. The 7th Engineer Battalion completed anchoring the bunkers at MACS-4, Monkey Mountain. This project is 85% complete. Construction of the two (2) 250 barrel water tanks at the 7th Engineer Battalion was slowed down due to lack of materials. The BAS at the 7th Engineer Battalion CP is presently 15% complete. The preparations for the footing and forms are complete and ready for concrete. All work is essentially complete with the exception of providing engineer assistance in the installation of the TV equipment in the TV Repeater shed at the Hai Van Pass.
  - (c) Engineer Comments Significant Events

20 August 1969 - 5 standard fighting culvert bunkers were completed at TRC-97

21 August 1969 - 2-30' sentry towers for the An Hoa Combat Base were flown into position.



#### (4) Operations - 22 - 28 August 1969

- (a) Horizontal Construction The 7th Engineer Battalion construction of an access road behind the berm at their CP was continued. The Provisional Land Clearing Company completed land clearing operations for tactical operation "Pipestone Canyon" on 24 August 1969. The 7th Engineer Battalion continued to support the 2nd ROK Brigade with 4 Eimco tractors, for their tactical land clearing operation. Upgrading and maintenance of QL-15 was continued by hauling, spreading, grading and rolling 888 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock and 74.8 cu.yds. of 6"(-) rock in the vicinity of the Thanh Quit, in preparation for paving. To aid in mine detection and dust suppression, 2000 gallons of oil was spread on QL-15 from BT 032604 to BT 048607. The upgrading of the An Hoa Road by hauling, spreading and compacting 12,283 cu.yds. of fill in the vicinity of AT 910515. There was 1140 cu.yds. of 3"(-) rock and 19,400 gallons of water were also hauled and spread in this same area. 6000 gallons of oil was hauled and spread on Route 540 from AT 922500 to AT 914510, to aid in mine detection and dust suppression.
- (b) Vertical Construction The 7th Engineer Battalion began construction of four 30' towers for the 610 Transportation Company. This project is presently 23% complete. At the Cam Le Bridge the Construction of the 12' x 12' generator shed was completed on 24 August 1969. On Hill 327, a 20' x 34' bunker was constructed by the 7th Engineer Battalion. This project was completed on 26 August 1969. Also on Hill 327, the site preparations for a 20' x 50' mess hall extension was begun. At the R&R center the eight 12' x 28' bunkers were completed on 24 August 1969. The cantonment project at the 5th/7th Communication Battalions was completed on 23 August 1969. Construction continued on the 250 man mess hall at the Hai Van Pass by erecting roof trusses and wall frames. The construction of two 175mm gun pads and two gun pads for 8" Howitzers were continued by the 7th Engineer Battalion. At MACS-4, Monkey Mountain all of the bunker construction is complete. Fugasse devices are to be installed near these sites as soon as materials become available. The construction of two 30' towers for the DaNang barrier are reported 22% complete. The construction of the Battalion Aid Station at the 7th Engineer Battalion CP has been slowed due to forming difficulties. At the Liberty Bridge 250 man mess hall the roof trusses and wall frames are being prefabricated so that they may be erected in the near future. The installation of lightning rods on 18-60 towers and 24-36 towers for the 2nd ROK Brigade is 52% complete.
