# NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 7th Engineer Battalion continued support of the III Marine Amphibious Force within the Danang area. The Battalion continued maintenance responsibility of 70 miles of road and conducted daily minesweeps of 25.5 miles of road. The Battalion maintained 6 water points in the Danang area producing 4,990,600 gallons of water. One platoon of the 1st Bridge Company is now in a TAD status to furnish tactical bridge support to the 9th Engineer Battalion at Chu Lai.

Company "A", 7th Engineer Battalion continued maintenance of Route 540 and Route 30 for class 50 traffic and maintenance of Route 540 from AT 899774 to AT 912743, Route 542 and Route 544. Company "A" also conducts daily minesweeps on Route 545.

Company "B", 7th Engineer Battalion continued expedient maintenance of QL-1S from the Cau Do river (QL-1B) to the Cau Lau River. Company "B" conducts minesweeps of Route QL-1S from AT 999707 to BT 042621.

Company "C", 7th Engineer Battalion continued upgrading of Route 540 from AT 912743 to AT 927608. Company "C" also conducts daily minesweeps of Route 540 from AT 943663 to AT 927608 and is in the process of upgrading this section of road.

Company "D", 7th Engineer Battalion continued upgrading of Route 540 from AT 927608 to AT 874460 for class 50 traffic and upgrade of Route 4 from AT 878576 to AT 911577. Areas east of Hill 37 and west of Hill 65 were inaccessable due to the current tactical situation. Company "D" conducts daily minesweeps of Route 540 from AT 927608 to AT 925533.

One officer and 47 enlisted men of 1st Bridge Company have been affected by the Phase III redeployment. This platoon embarked for CONUS on 22 February 1970.

- (a) Horizontal Construction The first week in February showed the Battalion hauled a total of 3,776 cubic yards to its lines of communications. The breakdown is as follows: The An Hoa LSA received 406 cubic yards of 6" and 658 cubic yards of 3" rock in the completion effort on its drainage; in conjunction with MCB 121, 1424 cubic yards of rock were hauled to QL-1S in preparation for paving; the An Hoa Road received a large portion of the Battalion's rock hauling efforts with 826 cubic yards being spread on the southern most portions of the road to alleviate the muddy conditions. Also 35 cubic yards of sand and 10,000 gallon of oil were hauled and spread on Route 540.
- (b) Vertical Construction Improvement of the defensive posture of Hill 34 continued during this period. These preparations are being made in order to fend off a supposed enemy attack on that position. Also, the defensive position of Hill 37 is undergoing vast improvements on its position during this TET period and also in preparation for Phase III redeployment. Seven bunkers and two SEA huts are in the construction phase. Two more SEA huts are scheduled to began whenever 2nd CAG decides on their position. Four 20' observation towers are under construction. Construction continued on the CCN camp at Marble Mountain. Currently we are installing a septic tank and completing installation of a head and shower unit. Installation of chain link RPG Barriers has commenced at Fire Support Base Los Banos. Difficulties have arisen in the the request for the fence doesn't meet the desires of those at Los Banos. ASP #1 is receiving some benefits of the 7th Engineer Battalion construction efforts. Work is in progress on a road and concertina fence at their position.

# (c) Engineer Comments

- (1) 5 February 1970 Completed the dismantling of the Cooper Bridge ferry The MiT6 bulk has been emplaced and the wench system is being installed.
- (2) 6 February 1970 Completed construction of five gun pads at Hill 65. Out of the five, only two of the gun pads will be used.
- (3) The Land Clearing efforts on Route 540 are going all out. Two TD-18's and five EIMCO's are clearing an average of about 40 acres per day.

#### 3. Operations 8 - 14 February 1970

(a) Horizontal Construction - With the ever present rain and the crachin still in evidence, the Battalion's rock hauled was not at a premium, A total 3,636 cubic yards of rock was hauled, spread and compacted on our road responsibilities. The southern most portion of the An Hoa road and the An Hoa LSA received the majority of our efforts. The road was improved with 665 cubic yards of rock while the drainage upgrade at the LSA received 742 cubic yards of rock. In conjunction with MCB - 121, 1,974 cubic yards of rock was hauled to upgrade Route QL-1S

and prepare its surface for paving. Surveyors worked setting grades on Route hw in advance of the upgrade of this highway.

(b) Vertical Construction - A cession in the construction phase of the RPG Barrier at Los Banos is currently the situation in which this project is involved. It seems that the requesting unit changed their minds as to location in the middle of placement. The construction agency has begun to remove its equipment from this location because of the indecisiveness. Another project involving indecisiveness is the four SEA huts for 2nd CAG. Currently two have been constructed and the remaining two are on a hold because of a quandary over their proper position. The well at 1st Shore Farty isn't fairing too well. After the initial installation. The well began drawing sand and had to be shut down. A second attempt is being conducted at this time. An increase in Press relations should become evident between the 7th Engineers and the local journalists. Construction has begun on a bunker to protect our news gatherers at the MACV Press Center. 1st Force Recon's redeployment from Hill 34 to Camp Adenir has once again called on the professional assistance of our nail-benders. A rejuvenation of the camp is underway to render it liveable. The Battalion even got involved in llth Marines Civil Affairs projects during this period. We constructed a three head shower, three SEA huts and a two hole head for Da Son Hamlet. Four (4) 20' tower are still in the construction phase for Hq Bn. Also, four fuel berms are in the building cycle at MAG - 16 to protect the fuel bladders adjacent to the runaway.

# (c) Engineer Comments - Significant Events

- (1) The 540 land clearing is winding up. About 810 acres of land were cleared between Liberty Bridge and An Hoa.
- (2) Five Tractors are still being provided to the 2nd ROK Brigade. The Korean are never positive of what areas they want cleared so our dozers have a lot of free time even through they remain in the Korean AO.

# (4) Operation 15 - 21 February 1970

(a) Horizontal Construction - With the close of another TET season, the 7th Engineer Battalion shifted its primary attention from personal security and welcomed "the Year of the Dog" with increased emphasis on engineer achievements. This time QL-1S was the battalions center of hauling efforts, with a total of 2310 cubic yards of 3" delivered in support of MCB - 121. The An Hoa LSA received 1148 cubic yards of 3" in continued efforts to rectify the muddy situation. Upgrading of Route 4W (AT 913591 - AT 877573) kicked off with a total of 357 cubic yards of 3" hauled during this period. Remaining efforts were devoted to moving 84 cubic yards of 6" and 287 cubic yards of 3" to improvement sites on Route 540.



- (b) Vertical Construction Rejuvenation of Camp Adenir has reached the half completion point at this time. The SEA huts and shower at Da Son Hamlet are well on their way for the 11th Marines Civil Affair Program. Very near completion are the four towers for Headquarters Battalion, as is the Delta Company defense positions, which were improved due to the 3rd phase redeployment program.
