NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 7th Engineer Battalion continued support of the III Marine Amphibious Force within the Danang area. The Battalion continued maintenance responsibility of 70 miles of road and conducted daily minesweeps of 25.5 miles of road. The Battalion maintained 8 water points in the Danang area producing 4,605,000 gallons of water. One platoon of the 1st Bridge Company is now in a TAD status to furnish tactical bridge support to the 9th Engineer Battalion at Chu Lai.

Company "A", 7th Engineer Battalion continued maintenance of Route 540 and Route 30 for class 50 traffic and maintenance of Route 540 from AT 899774 to AT 912743, Route 542 and Route 544. Company "A" also conducts daily minesweeps on Route 545.

Company "B", 7th Engineer Battalion continued expedient maintenance of QL-1S from the Cau Do river (QL-1B) to the Cau Lau River. Company "B" conducts minesweeps of Route QL-1S from AT 999707 to BT 042621 and of Route 5 from AT 933714 to AT 946731.

Company "C", 7th Engineer Battalion continued upgrading of Route 540 from AT 912743 to AT 927608. Company "C" also conducts daily minesweeps of Route 540 from AT 943663 to AT 927608 and is in the process of upgrading this section of road.

Company "D", 7th Engineer Battalion continued upgrading of Route 540 from AT 927608 to AT 874460 for class 50 traffic and maintenance of Route 4. Areas east of Hill 37 and west of Hill 65 were inaccessable due to the current tactical situation. Company "D" conducts daily minesweeps of Route 540 from AT 927608 to AT 925533. Company "D" also conducts minesweeps of Route 4 from AT 922576 to AT 968584.

- (2) Operations 1 2 January 1970
- (a) Horizontal Construction Upgrading and drainage construction at the An Hoa Landing Supporting Activity showed the 7th Engineer Battalion hauling 260 cubic yards of 6" (-) rock in an attempt to eliminate the muddy conditions. The final portions of the An Hoa road (Route 540) are also receiving rock from the 7th Engineer Battalion equipment. 45 cubic yards of 6" and 98 cubic yards of 3" rock was spread in an effort to complete the upgrading of this section of road. In continuation of the LOC construction, the 30" steel stringer bridge at the Little Thanh Quit had 105 cubic yards of 3" rock dropped behind the north abutment while at the sametime the deadwen and rods were being emplaced on the south abutment. On Route 40, the Battalion constructed a 30' steel stringer bridge at AT 927716 and almost completely rebuilt the superstructure of another bridge at AT 945711. Major maintenance was

accomplished on Route 544 as 401 cubic yards of 3" and 70 cubic yards of 6" rock were spread to improve the surface condition of the road.

- (b) Vertical Construction During this holiday period, the Battalion continued work on a 40' observation tower for the 3rd MP Bn and began construction of seven bunkers for 2nd CAG at Hoi An.
 - (c) Engineer Comments
- (1) 1 January 1970 A joyous and happy New Year is wished to all.
- (2) 1000 cubic yards of rock was hauled to the Battalion's lines of communication.
 - (3) Operations 3 9 January 1970
- (a) Horizontal Construction With the holiday season being over, the battalion once again put forth an increasing effort in upgrade/maintenance of its lines of communications. Once again the highlight of hauling, the An Hoa ISA received 1673 cubic yards of 6" rock in an attempt to alleviate the extremely muddy conditions. The resurfacing of Route 544 continued with 690 cubic yards of 3" and 350 cubic yards of 6" being spread. 462 cubic yards of sand, 801 cubic yards of 3" and 403 cubic yards of 6" rock was hauled and spread in the vicinity of An Hoa to effect completion of the upgrading of this road. On QI-IS at the site of the Little Thanh Quit Bridge, stringers are being emplaced and 511 cubic yards of rock was dumped for abutment fill. Bridge Company installed an expedient 30' tactical bridge on Route QI-IS at BT 047614 when the enemy dropped a section of the existing bridge. On 540, the battalion completed installation of a timber trestle bridge which required driving five (5) piles and major superstructures repairs at AT 943683.
- (b) Vertical Construction The battalion is currently in the process of constructing 3 30' towers for various units along with two (2) grease ratks, one for 1st Motor Transport Bn and one for its own Service Company. The long awaited water tanks have arrived and construction has resumed on the 250 BBL tank for 2/1. Construction efforts continued on the CCN camp at Marble Mountain with the installation of a shower and septic tank. Also, the bunkers for 2nd CAG were begun. The Utilities section of our Service Co is currently providing a secondary wiring system for 2/11 at An Hoa. In addition, we are currently constructing four (4) fuel berms at the MAG-16 Marble Mountain Air Facility. After a long awaited decision on placement, the five (5) gun pads at Hill 65 have been taken under the construction phase.
 - (c) Engineer Comments Significant Events
- (1) 6 January 1970 Emplacement of a 30' tactical bridge at BT 047614 to replace a bridge blown the previous evening.
- (2) 6 January 1970 Completion of major repairs on timber trestle bridge on Route 540 at AT 943683.

(b) Operation 10 - 16 January 1970

(a) Horizontal Construction - A fine effort by the battalion showed 4987 cubic yards of rock being hauled during the period. The break down is as follows: 1328 cubic yards of 6" (-) rock and 130 cubic yards of sand to the An Hoa LSA; 56 cubic yards of 3" (-) and 168 cubic yards of 6" (-) rock along with 1000 gallons of road oil to the bypass located at BT 006695; the An Hoa road received the majority of rock with 586 cubic yards of 3" (-) and 1432 cubic yards of 6" (-) rock along with 77 cubic yards of sand were hauled and parpareted in the completion effort; in maintenance work on our LOC's, 77 cubic yards of 6" (-) rock went to Route 542, 533 cubic yards of 3" (-) went to 544 and 46 cubic yards of 3" went to 545. 402 cubic yards of 3" (-) and 365 cubic yards of 6" (-) rock went to the north and south abutments of the Little Thanh Quit Bridge.

A 292 foot bridge was emplaced along-side the Golden Gate bridge on Route 1 Delta to enable traffic to pass until the bridge is repaired.

A 101' 5 float M4T6 was emplaced on 12 east over the Vinh Dien River until the moveable span is operational.

(b) Vertical Construction - Continued building the water tower and installing a head and shower unit for the CCN camp at Marble Mountain. While effort was being put forth on battalion projects such as the secondary distribution system for 2/11 at An Hoa, five (5) gun pads at Hill 65 and bunkers for 2nd CAG, the effort during this period was the preparation of Camp LOVE perimeter defense for the TET Season.

(c) Engineer Comments - Significant Events

(1) 10 January 1970 - Completed 250 bbl water tank for

(5) Operations 17 - 23 January 1970

- (a) Horizontal Construction A total of 3,118 cubic yards of rock was hauled by this battalion's equipment during this period. In the soil stabilization and drainage effort, the battalion hauled 280 cubic yards of rock to 2nd CAG at Hoi An and 1318 cubic yards of rock to the An Hoa LSA. 77 cubic yards was hauled to the Little Thanh Quit bridge for a abutment fill. On the battalion lines of communication, 470 cubic yards of rock was hauled in the completion effort of the An Hoa road. 790 cubic yards of rock were hauled in the resurfacing of Route 544 and 128 cubic yards of rock hauled in the maintenance of Route 545.
- (b) Vertical Construction The battalion continued its construction efforts on the bunkers at 2nd CAG, the 500 bbl water tank for 5th Marines at An Hoa and the ever existing construction on the CCN camp at Marble Mountain. A 10' tower is being constructed for MACS - 18 at An Hoa and a well for 1st Shore Party. Also, the construction of a concertina fence at ASP #1 has been undertaken.

- (a) Horizontal Construction A total of 3183 cubic yards of rock were hauled by the battalion during this period. The breakdown is as follows: An Hoa LSA showed 133 cubic yards of 3" (-) and 1049 cubic yards of 6" (-) hauled for drainage improvements; 46 cubic yards of 3" (-) and 1634 cubic yards of 6" (-) rock was hauled and compacted on the An Hoa project; and in the resurfacing of Route 544, 174 cubic yards of 3" (-) rock and 112 cubic yards of 6" (-) rock. Also, 21 cubic yards of 3" rock was hauled to the ferry approaches on Route 12 East.
- (b) Vertical Construction Construction was continued on the five gun pads at Hill 65, four are completed and we are awaiting a decision as to the placement of the fifth. 1075' of triple concentina has been laid around ASP #1 as of this date. The well for 1st Shore Farty to provide them with an embarkation wash-down point is well on its way as is the bunker for the MACV Press Center.
